Field Workers are employees who work in fields or nurseries where pesticides have been applied but do not handle pesticides themselves. Growers and Farm Labor Contractors are required to provide a pesticide safety training to their fieldworkers who may enter a treated field within 30 days after any pesticide application (herbicides, insecticide, fungicide, rodenticide, etc.). Workers must be trained before entering the field and every five years thereafter.

The training will be provided in Spanish by professional trainers from DPR and Cal OSHA.

Each participant will receive a Fieldworker Verification Card as proof that they have been properly trained.

The training is FREE but pre-registration is required this year. **To register your employees**, call:

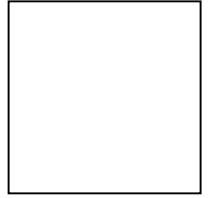

TIME SENSITIVE MATERIAL
