FIELDWORKER TRAINING

Field Workers are employees who work in fields or nurseries where pesticides have been applied but do not handle pesticides themselves. Growers and Farm Labor Contractors are required to provide a pesticide safety training to their fieldworkers before they enter any field that has been treated within 30 days with a pesticide (herbicides, insecticide, fungicide, rodenticide, etc.). Currently, fieldworkers must be trained every five years. Starting in 2017, this training will be required every year.

The training will be provided in Spanish by professional trainers from DPR and Cal OSHA.

Each participant will receive a Fieldworker Verification Card as proof that they have been properly trained.

The training is FREE but **pre-registration is required** by **Tuesday, June 14:**

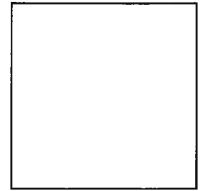
